SPF Symposium Speaker Bio



Dr. Anggia Utami Dewi is a faculty member at the Department of International Relations, Faculty of Social and Political Sciences, Universitas Padjadjaran, Indonesia. She completed her undergraduate study in Political Science (International Relations) in the university where she teaches now, and received her master degree in International Studies from Seoul National University. Her research interests include higher education and knowledge studies, globalization studies, and international migration. Since 2016, she is acted as an editorial team member of *Intermestic: Journal of International Studies*, a peer-reviewed academic journal on the field of international studies. In August 2022, she completed her doctoral training after finishing her dissertation on Indonesian higher education governance transformation under knowledge economy, and received her Doctor of Philosophy degree in Education from Seoul National University. Upon her return to Indonesia in October 2022, she starts serving as the Head of Internationalization Unit at her faculty.



Dr. Sumiya Baasandorj is a BK21 postdoctoral researcher at the Department of Mathematical Sciences, Seoul National University. His research interests are regularity for partial differential equations and partial differential equations in Mathematical Physics. He studied undergraduate mathematics at the Warsaw University of Technology from 2010 to 2014 and earned his master's degree from the Mongolian National University of Education in 2016 and a postgraduate diploma from the Diploma program of Abdus Salam International Centre for Theoretical Physics in 2017 meanwhile he was serving as a lecturer at Mongolian National University of Education. From 2017 to 2022, he did Ph.D. in Mathematics with a dissertation entitled "Regularity results for Orlicz phase problems" at the Department of Mathematical Sciences, Seoul National University.
