#### Purpose and Overview of the Program:

Among the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), Goal 11 "Sustainable Cities and Communities" represents a critical global challenge, whose importance is increasingly emphasized amid the accelerating pace of urbanization worldwide. Cities with historical heritage, in particular, face the dual challenge of achieving sustainable development while preserving their cultural legacy.

Traditional urban development models have often prioritized economic growth, frequently at the expense of historical identity and cultural integrity. Seoul, as the capital city that embodies the legacies of the 500-year Joseon Dynasty and the rapid economic development of modern Korea, serves as an exemplary case of efforts to preserve heritage while pursuing sustainable urban futures amid rapid urbanization and economic expansion.

By directly engaging with various sites in Seoul, students will explore the potential for development and preservation to generate mutual synergies rather than conflict. Furthermore, they will have the opportunity to examine how Korea's own rapid urbanization and development experience can be adapted and applied within the context of other countries. Through this, students from AUA member universities will gain field-based learning experiences that go beyond theoretical understanding.
